- Will emphasize the importance of "every day" math in your child's life.

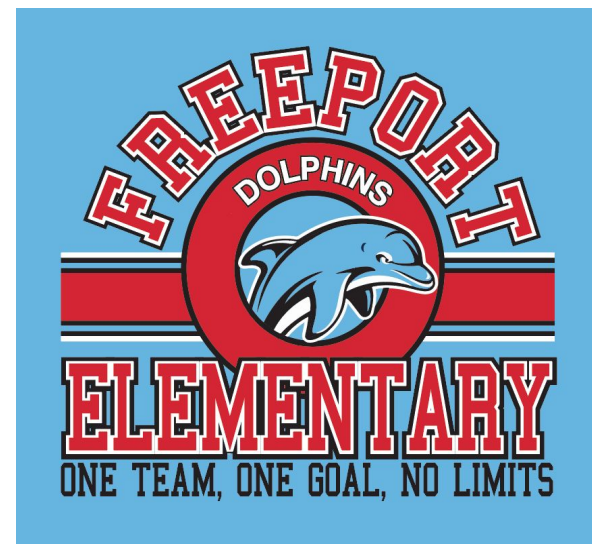

## Vision:

The Freeport Elementary community will build a solid foundation for ALL students.

## School Goals

- 1.) PK-Students will be able to identify 75% of upper and lower case letters and be able to produce 75% of the letter sounds by the EOY.
- 2.) K and 1st students-75% of students will be on Tier I at EOY
- 3.) 75% of K students will be on Level 4 and 75% of 1st grade students will be on Level 18
- 4.) K and 1st-80% Average and Above Average on TEMI

## Focus Areas:

- 1.) Students reading on grade level by the end of the school year.
- 2.) Students will be able to perform on grade level in Math.
- 3.) Students will have the social skills needed to be successful in the next grade level.

## Teachers

- Will model instruction and provide parents with reading materials and strategies.
- Will share a monthly Read 20/20 calendar to promote reading with your child at home.
- Will send home a daily communication folder.
- Will host school wide math and literacy family nights annually.
